

# ETIAS and ETA

**ETIAS** and **ETA** are travel authorisation schemes being implemented for visa-exempt nationals to visit certain European countries. The table below summarises and illustrates similarities and differences between the two schemes. Visa-exempt travellers travelling to the Schengen Area should also note the new scheme EES being implemented before ETIAS.

<b>Cost</b>	<b>€7 per person</b> (person aged under 18 or over 70 at time of application is exempt from paying although still need to apply)	<b>£10 per person</b> (payable by all ages)

# ETIAS and ETA

	Third country national (of any age) who is a <a href="#">family member of an EU/EFTA national</a> is also exempt from paying but only when travelling to a country that is not of their family member's nationality	
<b>Validity</b>	<b>3 years or until expiration of travel document</b> , whichever is sooner (multiple entries permitted during validity)	<b>2 years or until expiration of travel document</b> , whichever is sooner (multiple entries permitted during validity)
<b>To apply (in advance of travel)</b>	<p><b>Not currently possible to apply</b></p> <p>Apply either via official website or ETIAS mobile app (authorisation is linked to travel document i.e. passport)</p> <p>Dual nationals with two third country passports will be required to apply for an ETIAS linked to one of their passports. Applying for an ETIAS for each passport will not be permitted.</p>	<p><b>Currently only possible to apply for nationals of <a href="#">GCC countries</a></b></p> <p><b>From 27 November 2024</b> - rest of the world (excluding EU/EFTA)</p> <p><b>From 5 March 2025</b> - EU/EFTA nationals (excluding Irish) and European microstates</p> <p>Apply either via official website or ETA mobile app (authorisation is linked to travel document i.e. passport)</p>
<b>Air-side transiting</b>	Not required to apply	Required to apply
<b>Application form language</b>	24 (all official <a href="#">EU languages</a> )	1 (English)
<b>Biometric data when applying</b>	Not required as collected by EES	Facial image required if age 10+ applying via mobile app
<b>Third parties permitted to apply on behalf of traveller</b>	Yes (with <a href="#">declaration of representation</a> )	Yes (third party should use official website to apply where the traveller is not present with third party)
