

ETIAS and ETA

ETIAS and **ETA** are travel authorisation schemes being implemented for visa-exempt nationals to visit certain European countries. The table below summarises and illustrates similarities and differences between the two schemes. Visa-exempt travellers travelling to the Schengen Area should also note the new scheme EES being implemented before ETIAS.

Cost	€7 per person (person aged under 18 or over 70 at time of application is exempt from paying although still need to apply)	£10 per person (payable by all ages) Subject to UK Parliament approval, the application fee is proposed to increase to £16 per person. Start date of change to be confirmed.
Validity	3 years or until expiration of travel document , whichever is sooner (multiple entries permitted during validity)	2 years or until expiration of travel document , whichever is sooner (multiple entries permitted during validity)
